In addition to the homework tasks in the grids below, the following ongoing activities should be undertaken each week:

- Spelling practice (Given out on Tuesday and tested the following Monday)
- Independent reading, with or without an adult (recorded in reading diaries daily): Year 5 20-25 mins daily; Year 6 25-30 mins daily
- Learning, or improving on Multiplication and division facts up to 12x12 (Multiplication tables). How many different ways can you use to support this? (10 mins daily)
- Year 6 only: SATS style Papers - one per week.

You will have this sheet on Friday 12th January.</p> <p>Remember to use all the written calculation strategies that you have learnt to help you solve the problems. Always read the questions carefully and make sure that you go back after solving and ANSWER the question. Remember to show your working.</p> <p>To be completed by Friday 19th January.</p> 	<p>Family Activity</p> <p>Make a trail with sticks. Can your family or friends follow your trail successfully? Perhaps you could measure the distance and draw a map or write about your trip out and describe all the wonderful things you experienced using your senses to help paint the picture in the mind of the reader.</p> <p>(Taken from 50 things to do before you're 11½, National Trust).</p> 	<p>English: Poetry Recital</p> <p>Choose a poem to perform to the class. You must learn it off by heart and present it in written form or typed to put into your Homework book, together with some facts about the poet. Think of an interesting way to present the poem to the class eg: props, music, costume, Powerpoint backdrop. Think carefully about voice projection, expressive use of voice and pace, making the meaning clear to your audience.</p> <p>Be ready to perform your poem from the week beginning the 5th February.</p> 
<p>Art</p> <p>Draw or paint your own version of the Willow Pattern plate on a circular piece of paper. You can get some art paper from school for this project.</p> 	<p>Geography/English: China Factfile</p> <p>Find out all about China. How many interesting facts can you find out about? Present your findings using headings, subheadings, detailed information and explanations, bullet points, maps, pictures/diagrams, illustrations, captions.</p> <p>Remember to incorporate a wide variety of punctuation.</p> <p>To be completed by Friday 27th January</p> 	<p>Science: Earth and Space</p> <p>Write an explanation and describe how the Sun, the Earth and the Moon interact with one another in space? Describe what happens to create day and night. Describe why we have seasons. Include: headings, subheadings, bullet points, diagrams, illustrations, captions etc...</p> <p>You could also make a model to support your understanding if you would like.</p>
