# Sutton on the Forest C of E Primary School

## Sport Premium Report 2015-16

*NOR: 78 pupils aged 4-11*

### Principles

At Sutton on the Forest Primary School:

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all our pupils.
- We recognise that there are many benefits to ensuring that all children participate in sports or other physical activities:
  - ✓ Develops strength, mobility and physical endurance
  - ✓ Supports the establishment of healthy lifestyles for life
  - ✓ Helps in weight control, especially important in light of current levels of childhood obesity.
  - ✓ Develops social skills especially team work
  - ✓ Develops friendships
  - ✓ It is fun!
- Our intention is to use additional funding in three ways:
  - ✓ to broaden our provision to offer a wider remit of activities;
  - ✓ to train staff so that the provision becomes sustainable into the future;
  - ✓ to consolidate existing provision.

### Allocation

- Sport Premium Funding is universal and therefore our aim will be for maximum benefit for all our pupils, including and especially those that may not ordinarily see themselves as 'sporty'.

### Provision

Our typical current provision includes:

- ✓ Weekly 2 hours of PE teaching for all pupils.
- ✓ Swimming for all ages from Year 3 - a block of 10 weeks per year.
- ✓ Participation in local tournaments and leagues-some less traditional sports such as cross country; tri-golf etc.
- ✓ A wide range of extra-curricular clubs (according to term)
- ✓ External Provider Clubs- Martial Arts/Tennis Club (Reception -Y6)  
Football Club-York City Football in the Community
- ✓ Bikeability training for Y6
- ✓ Climbing Wall/Archery tuition-yearly event
- ✓ One week of specialist outdoor adventurous activities for Y6 as part of residential; sailing, canoeing, body surfing; climbing; orienteering; beck scrambling.

- ✓ Offer sports that children wouldn't experience otherwise
- ✓ Purchase good quality schemes of work for Gymnastics and Dance
- ✓ Work in partnership with ASA to offer a swimming programme that offers additional and enhanced swimming activities.
- ✓ Train Midday supervisory staff in "Active Play"
